



Data Law Committee – Vacancies

The City of London Law Society (CLLS) has established a new Data Law Committee and welcomes applications to fill the first seats on the committee.

The aim of the Committee is initially to focus on GDPR and e-Privacy and their application to, and impact on, the business world. There are clear opportunities for the Committee to contribute to the debate in a range of areas, including:

- responding to further ICO/WP29 consultations seeking to establish the practical consequences of GDPR;
- the impact of the proposed e-Privacy Regulation; and
- proposals for further regulation arising from advances in data-driven technologies.

The Committee does not anticipate at this stage that it will be considering data and information law topics such as FOIA.

Applicants should be members (including affiliates) of the CLLS either individually or as part of a CLLS Corporate Member firm, be enthusiastic about the opportunity to contribute to the work of the Committee, be at partner level or equivalent, and be able to commit enough time to participate in its work, including regular meetings in the City of London.
